Page number references and musical examples on the two assignment versions differ. Be sure to *print all pages of the assignment*.

- Want to raise your grade? Students working to improved their grades should pay attention to several important deadlines next week. See the week 11 calendar entry below for details.
 - This weekend is your last-chance opportunity to attend a concert for the optional second Concert
 Report assignment. However, if you wait until this weekend to attend and encounter problems, you may
 have difficulties completing your assignment by the deadline.
 - 2. Students qualifying for and desiring to re-take one of the earlier exams must submit their written requests by next Monday. See week 11 and week 12 in the calendar for additional information. (Note that specific conditions apply to this option and not all students are eligible. See the tests page for more information about this policy and the option to re-take one test. Addendum for spring 2016: For this quarter only I am experimenting with a modification of the re-take test policy. I am opening the re-take test option to all students in the class and not restricting it to students who earned a grade of lower than C on the original test. In addition, I will do a simply average of the original and re-take versions of the test and it will be possible to end up with a result that is higher than a C.)
 - 3. You may re-submit one of the earlier listening assignments (#1-#7) at the first class meeting of week eleven. This may be an assignment that you did not turn in or an assignment on which you would like to earn a higher grade.
 - 4. Plan to attend **Extra Credit concerts** by De Anza College Music Department groups at the end of the term. (Note that individual extra credit "reviews" are always due at the *next class session following the concert* and that late extra credit reviews are not accepted.)

Page number references and musical examples on the two assignment versions differ. Be sure to *print all pages of the assignment*.

- Several options for improving your grade are due this week:
 - Optional resubmission of one homework assignment Due at the first class meeting of the
 week. Students may resubmit one homework assignment selected from assignments #1-7 and earn
 a higher grade on it. No late submissions accepted under any circumstances. (You may turn this
 in earlier if you wish.)
 - 2. Optional second Concert Report due at the first class meeting of the week see green sheet for explanation. *Late reports are not accepted*.
 - 3. Optional Test Re-take requests are due at the first class meeting of the week. See the tests page and the final exam section listing below in this calendar for description of this option. If you meet the requirements to take advantage of this option (a grade lower than a C on test #1 or test #2) and you would like to re-take one of the tests to possibly raise that grade to as high as a C, you must turn in a written request by this deadline. Your request must include your name and the test you wish to re-take, either test #1 or test #2. Late requests are not accepted.
 - 4. Extra Credit "reviews" of concerts by De Anza College Music Department groups are always due at the next class session following the concert and late extra credit reviews are not accepted.)

- Optional retake of quiz #10 at second class meeting of the week.

Notes:

FINAL EXAMS WEEK

- Final exam session (test #3) for the Monday/Wednesday class is on Monday, 6/20 at 9:15-11:15AM.
- Final exam session (test #3) for the Tuesday/Thursday class is on Tuesday, 6/21 at 9:15-11:15AM

The test at the final exam schedule focuses on material since test #2 - in other words, on the music of the Romantic and 20th (and 21st) Century eras. It is *not* a comprehensive exam.

Due:

Any remaining extra credit reviews from concerts that took place between the last regular class meeting and the final exam must be submitted at your final exam session. Late extra credit reviews are not accepted.

Notes:

- Final exams are scheduled on <u>Monday through Friday</u> of week 12. You are required to attend the scheduled final exam session for your class. Exam sessions may be at different times and on different days than the regular class meetings during the rest of the term. Resolve all schedule conflicts (with other classes, your job, your family, etc.) well ahead of time, as exceptions to the published exam schedule are virtually never granted except in extraordinary circumstances.
- Students with a grade lower than a C* on test #1 or test #2 may optionally choose to also re-take one of those tests during the final exam session and raise their grade for that earlier test to as high as a C. After completing test #3 at the final exam session, qualifying students will be given a version of the earlier test that they have requested to re-take. See the tests page and the information in the week 11 section of this

calendar for additional requirements, including a deadline for submitting your request to re-take a test. (Note: You will not be allowed to re-take one of the tests unless you submitted a written request by the deadline as described in the week 11 section of the calendar.) *On an experimental one-time basis, during the spring 2016 term I have made this option available to all students regardless of their grade on the original exam, and it is possible to use the retake exam grade to achieve an overall grade higher than a C for that exam.

Grades will be posted online during the week after final exams at the latest and will remain available here for about one week after the end of the term. Check the web site for updates.
